

Sacraments

FIRST PENANCE & FIRST COMMUNION

Preparation for these Sacraments is a 2-year cycle, typically beginning in the 1st grade, with First Communion to be received at the end of the 2nd grade year. Preparation will be during the regular 1st & 2nd Grade Religious Education Classes at St. Luke's. There is a 21 class MINIMUM attendance requirement for the required prior year (typically the 1st grade year). Also, Baptism is needed at least 3 months prior to the reception of First Penance. Parents will attend *four* special sessions for these Sacraments. **Attendance at these Parents' Meetings is *mandatory* if your child will be receiving these sacraments during this school year.**

CONFIRMATION

Reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation requires attendance in a Catholic school, a parish religious education program, or a home school religious education program for at least 2 YEARS prior to reception of the sacrament.

Confirmation Prep Classes

This year our 9th & 10th graders will be meeting in the Admin. Bldg. on Sundays from 9:15-10:30am for their 2-year preparation of the Sacrament of Confirmation. We are using the *Chosen: Teen Faith Formation* curriculum put out by Ascension Press.

The Hidden Lake missionaries join us for these nights! Both groups meet on Wednesday nights, following the 6:00pm Mass, and go until 8:15pm. On Dinner & Doctrine nights (1st & 3rd Wednesdays of the month), the groups enjoy a meal with the parish before being excused at 7:15pm. Policies

MISSION STATEMENT

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, “Through the grace of the sacrament of marriage, parents receive the responsibility and privilege of *evangelizing their children* (2225).” It is the mission and purpose of the PSR program to serve the parishioners of St. Luke by assisting and empowering parents in carrying out this awesome responsibility. **The work of the staff and volunteers of St. Luke’s PSR is to assist you, not replace you.**

MASS ATTENDANCE

Mass attendance is the essential and central part of passing on the faith. **St. Luke’s Parish School of Religion complements, but does not replace, your children’s participation at the Sunday liturgy with their family.** We encourage and support your commitment to make sure your children attend Mass as well as classes and Wednesday night programs. Doing this will nourish and strengthen your family’s faith and understanding. Discuss with your family how you will schedule attending Sunday Mass as a family and also faithfully attend Religious Education classes and Wednesday night programs.

INVESTMENT IN OUR PROGRAM

Here at St. Luke’s we recognize that our program can only be successful in reaching all with the love of Christ with the help and support of our parents. **It is expected that, for every family whose children are enrolled in our Sunday morning classes, at least one adult is to serve in some capacity.**

FEES

Fees collected for PSR classes are for materials and supplies and are a one-time only fee (no other money is collected throughout the school year.) Scholarships and payment plans are available. These accommodations need to be discussed with and approved by Fr. John.

HOME STUDY

The Archdiocese of Atlanta allows for religious education to occur in a Catholic school, a parish school of religion, or a home school. If you are interested in more information regarding the home school option, just ask Kelley.

STUDENT ARRIVAL

Children Pre-K through 5th Grade must be escorted to their classrooms by a parent or guardian. Parents are encouraged to escort their children from 6th through 8th, but it is not required. **Students MUST be in class and seated by 9:15 AM each Sunday.** It is disruptive to the entire class when children arrive late.

STUDENT DISMISSAL

To ensure the safety of our children, we must require that a parent/guardian of children Pre-K through 5th grades park their cars and come into the building to pick up their children. No Pre-K through 5th Grade child will be permitted to leave the building without an adult. Classes end at 10:30 AM. Please be here on time to pick up your child so the catechists can attend Mass.

STUDENT CONDUCT

Life as a Christian is a commitment to live by the example of Jesus Christ. This commitment includes each student’s acceptance of responsibility for his or her conduct and actions, and each student’s commitment to respect the rights of others. Students are expected to: (1) attend class regularly; (2) participate in activities and discussion; (3) respect their teachers; and (4) respect each other.

DISCIPLINE

Normal discipline problems will be handled by the catechist. If a problem becomes persistent, the student will be sent to the director. A continuing problem may necessitate a call to parents, or a request that a parent attend class with the child or face removal from the program. Disciplinary infractions include, but are not limited to: abusive language, fighting, vandalism, disrespect to the teacher or other students, stealing, or leaving the building.

DRESS

Sunday dress is to be expected. Males or females dressed immodestly will not be tolerated. Violation or infraction may result in your child being pulled from the class or from the sacramental occasion.

WEATHER

In the event of inclement weather, classes may be cancelled. If we need to cancel classes, a group text will be sent (if a number has been provided). Also, if in doubt, check the parish website at www.stluckercc.org.

ATTENDANCE

Please make every effort to have your child attend class unless there are exceptional circumstances. In order to maintain enrollment for your child, the following attendance requirements must be met:

- 1. Your child may not have more than 5 unexcused absences or he/she will be considered withdrawn from the program***
 - 2. Your child must attend a minimum of 75% of scheduled classes to receive credit for the year.***
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PRAYER

It is in the family where our children are first introduced to the love and mercy of God. Praying and worshipping together as a family will serve well to solidify what is taught in our PSR classes. But even more effective is your prayerful example. Children who see their parents frequenting the sacraments and being active parish members will learn how to put their faith into action, which is the whole goal of St. Luke’s PSR.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd



- St. Luke's is proud to be starting the 4th year of our Level 1 Atrium. Our 3, 4, & 5 year olds are on their way to nourishing their relationship with God this 2017-2018 school year!
- The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a program based on the belief that young children already have a relationship with God by virtue of their Baptism. The Holy Spirit works through the catechists to nurture this love of God in these children.
- This method of faith formation was developed in 1954 by Sofia Cavalletti, a Scripture scholar, and Gianna Gobbi, a Montessorian.
- The Montessori method is a proven educational approach that emphasizes independence, freedom within limits, and respect of the child's individual ability and development. CGS uses this Montessori method to present Scripture and the sacraments to children.
- The work of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is done in a specially-prepared environment called an atrium.
- Through wondering questions and hands-on material, the children dive deep into the meanings of the Scriptures and prayers. These presentations they can repeat on their own during their work time.

Ignatius Press' Faith & Life Program
Curriculum Scope & Sequence 1st-8th

Grade 1: Our Heavenly Father

Theme: Introduction to the Holy Trinity; acquaints children with Mary, angels, and the saints. Children learn basic prayers.

Grade 2: Jesus Our Life

Theme: Preparation for the first reception of the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion, with the law of God and salvation history as background, with an emphasis on God's mercy and love. Covers creation, the covenant with Moses, the Ten Commandments, redemption, forgiveness of Sins, and the Mass.

Grade 3: Our Life with Jesus

Theme: God's plan of salvation, from creation to the incarnation and redemption to the birth of the Church at Pentecost and our life in the Church. Special emphasis on the importance of Confession, Communion and the Mass.

Grade 4: Jesus Our Guide

Theme: God's plan to save his people from sin (Salvation History), how we participate in that plan, and the many ways God helps us in our pilgrimage on earth to heaven through his word, his law, and his Church.

Grade 5: *Credo*: I Believe

Theme: A thorough study of the articles of the Creed as the basic belief of our Catholic faith, with a special emphasis on careful understanding of definitions through the words of the gospels, and the prophets, and the prayers of the Church.

Grade 6: Following Christ

Theme: The blueprint for a life of love: the law of God, especially in the Ten Commandments, and the presence of Jesus in the Holy Mass.

Grade 7: The Life of Grace

Theme: Grace is our link with God, His gift to us to bring us to Himself and his eternal life, with an emphasis on transmission of grace through the seven sacraments. Also discussed is the role of grace in developing the virtues.

Grade 8: Our Life in the Church

Theme: The history of the Church — its founding by Christ, its birth in the Holy Spirit, the marks of the one, true Church, the Fathers and Doctors of the Church, the saints and the role of the religious and laity up to the present. The structure of the Church Jesus planned, the role of the Magisterium, the clergy, the religious and the laity and our own vocations.
