Dear Parents,

By enrolling your child in the St. Luke Parish School of Religion, you are taking an important step forward in the truth that the family is the domestic church. Pope St. John Paul II said the seeds of our faith are planted in the family. Your moral responsibility as parents is to see that your children are trained in the faith and teachings of the Church. In sum, your role is to get your children to heaven. The clergy and lay instructors never replace your role, nor relieve you of this high calling you have received. Parents must oversee the spiritual growth of their child in the area of faith and morals.

Frequent reception of the sacraments by Sunday Mass (and daily Mass where possible) and frequent confession are cornerstones of a healthy spiritual life. Along with daily prayer and reading scripture, they keep our interior life going. These practices show with our actions where our hearts lie - in the passing things of this world, or in the God who loves us, who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

An old cliché says, a picture is worth a thousand words. Pope St. John Paul II remarked that an image that stood out in his youth was getting up in the middle of the night and seeing his father on his knees praying (his mother had died years before). The saint said that experience of his youth was his first seminary. Once again my dear parents, God's plan is that you take care very well of the faith of your family. The one thing necessary is making disciples of Christ. Our children are also the future of the Church. Let's give our next generation of Catholics the tools necessary to know and defend their faith and become saints.

# Policies

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## MISSION STATEMENT

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, “Through the grace of the sacrament of marriage, parents receive the responsibility<sup>1</sup> and privilege of *evangelizing their children* (2225).” It is the mission and purpose of the PSR program to serve the parishioners of St. Luke by assisting and empowering parents in carrying out this awesome responsibility. **The work of the staff and volunteers of St. Luke’s PSR is to assist you, not replace you.**

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## MASS ATTENDANCE & FAMILY PRAYER

Mass attendance is the essential and central part of passing on the faith. **St. Luke’s Parish School of Religion complements, but does not replace, your children’s participation at the Sunday liturgy with their family.** Praying and worshipping together as a family will serve well to solidify what is taught in our PSR classes. We encourage and support your commitment to make sure your children attend Mass as well as classes and Wednesday night programs. Discuss with your family how you will schedule attending Sunday Mass as a family and also faithfully attend Religious Education classes and Wednesday night programs.

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<sup>1</sup> All faith formation offered at the parish is grounded in the Catholic faith; without it, the parish is unable to achieve its mission. All catechists, other volunteers, and parents or legal guardians are therefore expected to demonstrate support for the parish’s mission by respecting the teachings of the Catholic faith and not contradicting or criticizing them publicly, in words or actions, including through online social media venues.

It is important to understand that over the course of the parish’s faith formation program all participants and volunteers are exposed to teachings that include the Catholic Church’s understanding of marriage as a union exclusively between a man and a woman, that sexual relationships outside of marriage are contrary to Catholic Church teaching, and that sexual identity is grounded in being created as male or female in the image of God. While St. Luke the Evangelist is committed to ensuring that all tenets of the Catholic faith are shared and discussed with respect, compassion, and sensitivity, especially with those who may struggle with them, the parish expects all catechists and parents/guardians to demonstrate support for these and all the teachings of the Roman Catholic faith in a manner consistent with the obligations they freely enter into when they volunteer or enroll.

## FEES

Fees collected for PSR classes are for materials and supplies and are a one-time only fee (no other money is collected throughout the school year.) Scholarships and payment plans are available. These accommodations need to be discussed with and approved by Fr. Matt.

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## HOME STUDY

The Archdiocese of Atlanta allows for religious education to occur in a Catholic school, a parish school of religion, or a home school. If you are interested in more information regarding the home school option, just ask Kelley.

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## STUDENT ARRIVAL

**Children Pre-K through 5<sup>th</sup> Grade must be escorted to their classrooms by a parent or guardian.** Parents are encouraged to escort their children from 6<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup>, but it is not required. **Students MUST be in class and seated by 9:15 a.m. each Sunday.** It is disruptive to the entire class when children arrive late.

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## STUDENT DISMISSAL

**To ensure the safety of our children, we must require that a parent/guardian of children Pre-K through 5<sup>th</sup> grade park their cars and come into the building to pick up their children. No Pre-K through 5<sup>th</sup> Grade child will be permitted to leave the building without an adult.** Classes end at 10:30 a.m. Please be here on time to pick up your child so the catechists can attend Mass.

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## STUDENT CONDUCT

Life as a Christian is a commitment to live by the example of Jesus Christ. This commitment includes each student’s acceptance of responsibility for his or her conduct and actions, and each student’s commitment to respect the rights of others. Students are expected to: (1) attend class regularly; (2) participate in activities and discussion; (3) respect their teachers; and (4) respect each other.

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## DISCIPLINE

Normal discipline problems will be handled by the catechist. If a problem becomes persistent, the student will be sent to the director. A continuing problem may necessitate a call to parents, or a request that a parent attend class with the child or face removal from the program. Disciplinary infractions include, but are not limited to: abusive language, fighting, vandalism, disrespect to the teacher or other students, stealing, or leaving the building.

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## DRESS

Sunday dress is to be expected. Males or females dressed immodestly will not be tolerated. Violation or infraction may result in your child being pulled from the class or from the sacramental occasion.

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### WEATHER

In the event of inclement weather, classes may be canceled. If we need to cancel classes, a group text will be sent to all enrolled families (if a number has been provided). Also, if in doubt, check the parish website at [www.stlukercc.org](http://www.stlukercc.org).

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### ATTENDANCE

Please make every effort to have your child attend class unless there are exceptional circumstances. In order to maintain enrollment for your child, the following attendance requirements must be met:

1. *Your child may not have more than 5 unexcused absences or he/she will be considered withdrawn from the program*
  2. *Your child must attend a minimum of 75% of scheduled classes to receive credit for the year.*
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## PSR Curriculums

### ➤ Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (Pre-K and Kindergarten)

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a program based on the belief that young children already have a relationship with God by virtue of their Baptism. The Holy Spirit works through the catechists to nurture this love of God in these children. Catechists utilize the Montessori method to present Scripture and the sacraments to children. Through wondering questions and hands-on material, the children dive deep into the meanings of the Scriptures and prayers. ### ➤ Faith & Life Series (1<sup>st</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade)

Grade 1: Our Heavenly Father

Introduction to the Holy Trinity; acquaints children with Mary, angels, and the saints. Children learn basic prayers.

Grade 2: Jesus Our Life

Preparation for the first reception of the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion, with the law of God and salvation history as background, with an emphasis on God's mercy and love. Covers creation, the covenant with

Moses, the Ten Commandments, redemption, forgiveness of Sins, and the Mass.

Grade 3: Our Life with Jesus

God's plan of salvation, from creation to the incarnation and redemption to the birth of the Church at Pentecost and our life in the Church. Special emphasis on the importance of Confession, Communion and the Mass.

Grade 4: Jesus Our Guide

God's plan to save his people from sin (Salvation History), how we participate in that plan, and the many ways God helps us in our pilgrimage on earth to heaven through his word, his law, and his Church.

Grade 5: *Credo*: I Believe

A thorough study of the articles of the Creed as the basic belief of our Catholic faith, with a special emphasis on careful understanding of definitions through the words of the gospels, and the prophets, and the prayers of the Church.

Grade 6: Following Christ

The blueprint for a life of love: the law of God, especially in the Ten Commandments & the presence of Jesus in the Holy Mass.

Grade 7: The Life of Grace

Grace is our link with God, His gift to us to bring us to Himself and his eternal life, with an emphasis on transmission of grace through the seven sacraments. Also discussed is the role of grace in developing the virtues.

Grade 8: Our Life in the Church

The history of the Church- its founding by Christ, its birth in the Holy Spirit, the marks of the one, true Church, the Fathers and Doctors of the Church, the saints and the role of the religious and laity up to the present. The structure of the Church Jesus planned, the role of the Magisterium, the clergy, the religious and the laity and our own vocations.

## Confirmation Prep Classes

Our 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> graders will be meeting on Sundays from 9:15-10:30 a.m. for their 2-year preparation of the Sacrament of Confirmation. The curriculum that we follow is based on *Decision Point* – a Confirmation preparation program from The Dynamic Catholic Institute – with additional resources from the *YOUCAT (Youth Catechism)* series.

“It [*Decision Point*] began with a dream – to give catechists, youth ministers, sponsors, parents, pastors and Directors of Religious Education the tools they need to engage young Catholics in a meaningful conversation about the genius of Catholicism in preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation...Our young people need to be evangelized. They need to hear the Gospel in a way that is fresh, intriguing, relevant, compelling, and attractive...It is our hope that this program will not only prepare young Catholics for the Sacrament of Confirmation in a dynamic way, but also teach and inspire them to respond and cooperate with God’s grace in all the circumstances of their daily lives, long after their Confirmation has passed.”

### Post-Confirmation. . . What Now??

We urge those teens who have already received the Sacrament of Confirmation to either deepen their faith by attending our Adult Education class in the Parish Hall during Sunday morning class time or put their faith into practice by assisting in a classroom.



### Middle & High School Youth Groups

We are a Life Teen affiliated parish! This means that we have access to the incredible resources that Life Teen offers to better reach our middle and high school students, so that they can grow and experience a deeper relationship with Christ. Our youth group with resume regular meetings after our new youth minister, Victoria Thompson, joins our St. Luke staff the end of August 2022. Keep abreast of events through our weekly parish bulletin, Sunday Mass announcements, and e-blasts.

# Sacraments

## FIRST PENANCE & FIRST COMMUNION

*Preparation for these Sacraments is a 2-year cycle, typically beginning in the 1<sup>st</sup> grade, with First Communion to be received at the end of the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade year.* Preparation will be during the regular 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Religious Education Classes at St. Luke’s. There is a 21 class MINIMUM attendance requirement for the required prior year (typically the 1<sup>st</sup> grade year). Also, Baptism is needed at least 3 months prior to the reception of First Penance. Parents will attend *four* special sessions for these Sacraments. **Attendance at these Parents’ Meetings is mandatory if your child will be receiving these sacraments during this school year.**

## CONFIRMATION

Reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation requires attendance in a Catholic school, a parish religious education program, or a home school religious education program for at least 2 YEARS prior to reception of the sacrament. In the Archdiocese of Atlanta, students are to be confirmed in the 10<sup>th</sup> grade.
